Planning for entry into graduate degree programs includes the filing of applications and the successful completion of appropriate admission tests. Some graduate school admission tests now offer computer-based testing (CBT) administration. Check the appropriate graduate school admission test bulletins or the Web sites indicated below for further information about computer-based testing administration or registering online for paper-and-pencil tests. The testing dates and respective deadlines noted are for the paper-and-pencil administration and have been compiled for your convenient reference. Please note that receipt deadlines indicate the dates by which applications for admission tests must be received.

Dental Admission Test

In order to register for the DAT students must apply and receive an e-mail notification of eligibility. You must receive an eligibility letter prior to scheduling your testing appointment. Graduate Management Admission Test (for Graduate Business Schools)

The Graduate Management Admission Tests (GMAT®) will be offered through computer-adaptive tests (CAT®) given in hundreds of locations around the world several times a month. To register, you must first select a test center location (refer to the Test Center List in Appendix B of the *GMAT Information Bulletin*, which is available in the Career Resource Center at Career Services or at www.mba.com/testcenterlist). Once you have selected a test location, you may schedule a test appointment online (www.mba.com), by phone (1-800-717-GMAT), by fax (1-952-681-3681), or by mail (scheduling form is in the *GMAT Information Bulletin*). Graduate Record Examination (for Arts & Science, Education, and other disciplines)

The **General Test** is a computer-based test given year-round in numerous locations. You may register online, by phone, or by mail. For test locations and more information on registration, access www.ets.org/gre. The *GRE Information and Registration Bulletin* is available online and in the Career Resource Center at Career Services.

The **Subject Tests** are paper-based tests and will be offered in October, November, and April. Subject tests are offered in the following disciplines: Biochemistry, Cell & Molecular Biology; Biology; Chemistry; Computer Science; Literature in English; Mathematics; Psychology; and Physics.
