Please bring the following supplies to your workshop:

Although most basic woodworking tools are available at Miami University, students are welcome to bring some of their own such as:

- hammer
- safety glasses
- thin work gloves
- dust masks
- hand clippers
- Sureform rasps
- Quick Grips
- Japanese razor saw, any kind
- Electric drill
- 1/16" drill bits
- variety of brad point drill bits
- yardstick or tape measurer
- wood glue
- pair needle nose pliers
- wire cutters
- Phillips head driver bit
- box cutter knives

Also, be prepared to transport your projects at the completion of this workshop. Blankets for padding, rope, and bungee cords will help secure your furniture. Wear comfortable clothing that allows for physical activity and ease of movement.

Optional supplies:

Raw materials:

Bring what wood you can but avoid Ash and branches that have been on the ground for awhile.

Willow branches and twigs pre-cut in lengths ranging from approximately 3' – 8'. We'll be using twigs as small as 1/2" and a variety of branches that are 1" - 6" thick. Straight and curvy, they all are good! Other local types of wood such as maple, oak, hornbeam, walnut, and box elder will work too. Willow is what I almost always work with but for this class, really anything will do that's strong. A variety of curved, bent, and straight pieces should be gathered. Wood should be stored away from the elements of weather. Miami University and the instructor will also provide wood.

Quantity: we're estimating that you should bring a bundle of raw material that measures at least 18 inches in diameter with varying lengths, up to 8 feet long. Bring more if you have it available. Your instructor will also be bringing raw materials.

Note: No ash trees should be moved from county to county.
