ALL HAIL THE KING

After forty-seven years of teaching, Dr. Shideler will retire from Miami University in June, 1957, so that he can begin work on other interests. His first task will be acceptance of the John Hay Whitney Foundation grant for outstanding teachers in the United States. This award is granted to ten teachers each year that are chosen from over 700 colleges and universities. Doc's new position will take him to Hiram College, Ohio, where he will serve as a Special Lecturer and set up a geology department.

There is probably no other man on the campus than Dr. Shideler who is more respected by the administration, faculty members and students. During his long teaching tenure he has often been invited by past presidents and other university officials for his personal evaluation of various problems. Not only is he well-known and highly regarded on the Miami campus, but his many awards from other universities and learned societies give concrete evidence that his viewpoints are mutually respected on a national basis. At the present time no other man on campus more exemplifies "Mr. Miami" than does "Doc" Shideler.

As a teacher, Dr. Shideler has built the Miami geology department from a small combined department of geology and zoology to a separate unit of geology with a permanent teaching staff of seven plus a temporary teaching staff of six, a department which grants approximately eight masters degrees per year, twenty bachelors degrees per year, and a combined undergraduate enrollment in geology of 600-650 students. Besides being housed in a separate building, the geology department maintains a permanent summer field camp near Dubois, Wyoming. Many of Dr. Shideler's students have continued on to a Ph.D. and some continue on to occupy important geological and administrative positions in this country and abroad. The growth of the Miami geology department could not have occurred without the guidance and understanding of Dr. Shideler.

Along with being crowned with scholastic success, Dr. Shideler has succeeded equally well in social, civic and extra-curricular endeavors. He is a founder of Phi Kappa Tau, a social fraternity with seventy-two chapters across the country; Vice-President of Sigma Gamma Epsilon, a geology honorary; past President of the American Geology Teachers; former President of the Ohio Academy of Sciences; former Chairman of the Mid-American Conference, athletic; an active member of Phi Beta Kappa, scholastic honorary; Omicron Delta Kappa, men's leadership society, and is probably the most active speaker on our campus, both from a local and national standpoint.

Dr. Shideler would be the first to admit that the helping hand behind all of his successes has been his gracious wife who herself is equally successful in her lines of endeavor.

A banquet to honor Dr. Shideler will be held on the evening of June 7th on Miami's campus at one of the dormitories. Everyone who can attend is welcome to do

so. If you plan to attend graduation, please do not miss this chance to see "Doc"

During the past year Doc has continued work in the geology department by completing some partially finished papers, giving the staff advice on local geology and taking part in many fraternal and university activities. Brice was not quite the same without his teaching.

Perhaps we should repeat the salute "All Hail the King". Karl Limper is the new chairman of the department and is rapidly becoming acclimated to the paper work and the trials and tribulations associated with the position. Karl presented a paper at the 1956 meeting of the Ohio Academy of Sciences titled, "Chitinozoa from the Waynesville Formation, Oxford, Ohio".

Wayne Martin is the new president of the east-central section of the Association of Geology Teachers, after having served as vice-president during the past year. Wayne has continued his usual high attendance at various geological meetings.

David Scotford has been awarded a \$1,000 Miami summer research fellowship during the summer of 1957. His work is concerned with differential thermal analysis and x-ray defraction of various silicate minerals.

A one month leave of absence was granted to James Bever in February, 1957, to permit him to serve as a consultant for the Strategic Mineral Section of the Materials Advisory Board. During the sojourn Jim visited many mines and stockpile areas in northeastern United States.

Roy Reinhart has begun collecting material for a historical text and plans to spend the 1957 summer on this project.

Perhaps some insight into the changes that have occurred in the Miami geology department can be gleaned from the following figures. With the opening of the hallowed halls in the fall of 1956, the staff was met by 540 beginning students of which 20 are definitely majors; 60 geology majors from the sophomore to senior level; 23 graduate masters candidates. Two new staff members aided in greeting the unprecedented number of geology students. Dr. Perry Stewart is the new assistant professor who comes to Miami after three years of teaching at Michigan State and seven years at Marshall College. Stewart teaches Structural Geology, Geology of the U.S., Ground Water and an advanced course in Glacial Geology. During recent summers he has worked on glacial geology for the New York and Vermont Geological Surveys.

We are also fortunate to obtain the services of Owen Homeister from Texas Tech, Miami's extension center in Texas. Owen obtained his bachelors and Masters degree at Miami, completing the latter in 1950. Following his graduation he worked four years for Magnolia Petroleum Co. in Kansas and Nebraska.

The teaching assistants for the 1956-57 school year are William Bishop, Charles Kahle, Ron Helman, Donald Stearns, Albert Bersticker, Earl Harris and David Roddy.
