The TEAM Scholarship at Miami University

The TEAM Scholarship (Teacher Education Access at Miami) provides a 50 percent tuition and fee scholarship for Ohio professional educators to do graduate course work at Miami.

Any educator that meets the following requirements will be eligible for the scholarship:

- Educator is a full-time teacher or administrator in an Ohio school district or school (public, private, or charter).
- Educator is a resident of the State of Ohio.
- Educator holds a provisional or professional license or holds a standard certificate issued by the State of Ohio.
- Degrees, courses, or continuing education workshops are part of the educator's approved professional development plan and are at the graduate level.
- Approved applications are good for one academic year (fall through summer). An application should be submitted before the semester begins.

- Transcript of the highest degree earned from an accredited institution (not required if your highest degree was awarded by Miami University or if you are seeking non-degree status).
- Non-refundable application fee: \$35 for degree seeking students, \$15 for non-degree seeking students.
