For fall semester consideration, all credentials must be on file by May 1; for spring semester, by November 1.

All deadlines are strictly enforced.

To apply for admission:

Before an admission decision can be made, your application to Miami needs to include:

- Application parts 1, 2, and 3 completed and signed (original signatures only).
- Your PSEOP application fee: a non-refundable check or money order for \$45 made payable to Miami University. Please put the applicant's name on the check.
- Official high school transcript and current class schedule. A middle school grade report is required for applicants currently enrolled in 8th grade.
- Official ACT test scores sent directly from the testing agency.
- Letter of recommendation (for participation during 9th and 10th grades).

Post-secondary enrollment options (PSEOP)

Miami University is committed to fulfilling the spirit and letter of the State's program for Post-Secondary Enrollment Options. To be truly successful and beneficial, all those involved (schools, parent/guardians, students, and Miami University) must work together to identify students who are intellectually and emotionally capable of succeeding in the university environment.

Participation in this program is not intended to replace course work available at the high school, but rather to enhance the educational opportunities available to students while in high school.

There are two options available for students under this program:

Option A: college credit only; financial responsibility (tuition, fees, and books) rests with the student and his/her parent or guardian.

Option B: college/high school credit, the State reimburses the university.

Requirements for Oxford campus admission

1. For each academic year (two semesters), apply and have all credentials on file by May 1 for fall semester admission consideration; for spring semester, apply by November 1. Once you are enrolled and registered for the fall term, you don't need to reapply for the spring semester of the same academic year; however, you are required to submit Part 3 of the application to Advising and meet with the program adviser to register for that term. If after being accepted and enrolled for the fall term, you do not attend, your application will be inactivated and you must reapply for the spring term.
2. The Post-Secondary Enrollment Options Program is limited to the fall and spring semesters of the academic year. To continue in the summer sessions, please contact the Office of Admission.
3. Students must commute from the home of their parent/legal guardian.
4. A \$45 non-refundable fee must be paid by the applicant and accompany the application.
5. **All** applicants must submit official ACT scores. SAT scores are not acceptable for consideration of admission to the post-secondary program. Successful applicants should have a minimum 24 ACT composite score. For specific course placement, students who meet all other admission criteria may be admitted with less than the required composite if an individual subscore predicts successful achievement for the specific course according to the norms established by the American College Testing program for Miami University.
6. Academic performance:
 - Participation during 9th grade**
 - 8th grade performance reports showing superior academic performance in all academic areas.
 - A written recommendation from the sending school that the student demonstrates the academic ability and social/emotional maturity to successfully participate in college level classes in a collegiate environment. *This recommendation should be written by a teacher in the subject area in which the applicant is requesting course placement.*
 - Participation during 10th grade**
 - Complete a minimum of 5 units of the minimum core of 16 college preparatory units with a cumulative grade point average (g.p.a.) of at least 3.5.
 - First-time applicants must submit a written recommendation from the sending high school that the student demonstrates the academic ability and social/emotional maturity to successfully participate in college-level classes. *This recommendation should be written by a teacher in the subject area in which the applicant is requesting course placement.*
 - Participation during 11th grade**
 - Complete a minimum of 9 units of the minimum core of 16 college preparatory units with a cumulative g.p.a. of at least 3.5 and an overall class rank in the upper 20 percent.
 - Participation during 12th grade**
 - Complete a minimum of 13 units of the minimum core of 16 college preparatory units with a cumulative g.p.a. of at least 3.5 and an overall class rank in the upper 20 percent.

Orientation and course registration

Miami will mail information about orientation and course scheduling to students after Miami has confirmed their admission into the Post-Secondary High School program. Students must attend an orientation program and arrange their class schedule with an academic adviser. Course scheduling is subject to availability and appropriate course placement testing.

During the orientation/registration session, Miami will provide a list of courses, developed in consultation with academic departments, which may be taken under this program. In general, Miami Plan Foundation courses will be available. In all classes, students will be expected to follow all stated prerequisites. Ninth and 10th grade participants may enroll in only one academic course per semester on a space-available basis. Eleventh and 12th grade participants may take more than one course depending on their high school schedule and qualifications for the program.

To continue in the program, all participating students must maintain a minimum 2.0 Miami g.p.a. and meet the high school unit, g.p.a., and rank requirements for their grade level. Participants must reapply for admission for each fall of the academic year that they wish to continue enrollment.

Students in this program will be expected to know and follow all rules and regulations as outlined in the Miami University Student Handbook.

Commonly asked questions

I attend a non-public school. Can I participate in PSEOP under Option B?

For non-public students, the cost of the program is covered by a specified amount as determined by the Ohio legislature. Once accepted by an Ohio college or university, the non-public school student must submit a preliminary application form (Form SF-PS 140NPP) with a copy of the college letter of acceptance prior to enrollment to the Ohio Department of Education, Office of School Finance area office. The application form won't be processed without the college letter of acceptance. Financial support is available on a first come-first served basis. If funds are available, the student will be notified within three weeks. If funds are not available, the non-public student, non-public school, and college will be notified within one week.

I am an Ohio resident but I am home-schooled. Can I participate in PSEOP?

Students must be enrolled in a public or private school to be eligible for PSEOP. (Please note: "enrollment" is different from "registering" as a home-schooled student with your local board of education.) If you are enrolled, but you do not attend school, you will need to submit additional materials for admission review of your educational background. For specific requirements, please contact the Office of Admission.

Are all classes available to high school students?

No, courses and programs are limited to the approved PSEOP course list. Many will require prerequisite knowledge and skill. Eligible courses are open on a space-available basis in this program.

Must I submit a complete application for each semester I want to enroll?

No, if you are enrolled and registered in the fall, you don't need to reapply for the spring semester of the same academic year; however, you are required to submit Part 3 of the application and meet with the program adviser in order to register for that term. For each new academic year (beginning in the fall), you must submit a complete application by May 1. If after being accepted and enrolled for the fall term, you do not attend, your application will be inactivated and you must reapply for the spring term.

How do I remain eligible for the program?

You must maintain a 2.0 cumulative g.p.a. in your Miami courses and also maintain the required g.p.a. and rank in your school. (You must take all courses for a letter grade.)

Can I enroll in both Post-Secondary Option A and B at the same time (for two different courses)?

No, you must select either Option A or B for each semester enrolled. However, you can apply in a following semester and change options at that time. You may not change options after you have registered.

How do I register?

After your application is approved, Miami will send you orientation/registration information.

If I enroll under Option A, when are my fees due?

Your fees are due when you register.

Can I use the Recreational Sports Center?

Yes, but you must first pay the member fees.

Am I eligible to take part in ROTC programs, intercollegiate athletics, and extracurricular organizations?**Can I receive financial aid from Miami University?**

No, you must be a full-time matriculated Miami University student to be eligible for these organizations and services.

What are the risks involved in enrolling under either Option A or B?

Grades: You will have a permanent college transcript. You may be required to submit that transcript to all future colleges to which you apply for admission. Poor performance in this program may jeopardize future college admission.

Course availability: The availability of your preferred course cannot be guaranteed. At the time you are eligible to register for courses, the course may be closed, or the section offered at the time you prefer may not be available. You should have a full high school schedule as a backup.

Is there a particular risk when enrolling under Option B?

Yes. If you stop attending class or withdraw from a course, your school district may require that you pay all standard tuition and fees that all college students are required to pay. You should also be aware that universities outside of the State of Ohio may not accept credit earned under Option B, and private colleges or universities will vary on this issue.

If I have been academically dismissed from the Post-Secondary Enrollment Options Program, can I ever be eligible to be readmitted?

Students who have been dismissed are eligible to be considered for readmission after a two-semester absence from the program.

Does acceptance into this program mean that after I graduate from high school I will be automatically admitted to Miami as a regular undergraduate student?

No. The Post-Secondary Enrollment Options Program student is not a regularly enrolled (matriculated) Miami student. However, you are encouraged to apply for regular admission by submitting the application fee and all required documentation. Your application will be given the same consideration as any other applicant.

After I graduate from high school, if I'm accepted for admission to Miami's Oxford campus, will I be eligible to live in an upperclass residence hall?

No, if you apply to live in university housing, you will be placed in a first year residence hall regardless of the number of college credits you have earned.

Are there special admission requirements for foreign exchange or international students?

Yes, students from non-English speaking nations or foreign schools must submit acceptable TOEFL scores. Please make sure to register for this test well in advance of your PSEOP application since Miami usually receives TOEFL scores from the testing agency about six to eight weeks after you have taken the test.

For how many semesters may I take PSEOP courses?

If you remain eligible and make satisfactory progress throughout the program, you may participate for a maximum of four academic years. If you start participating at the beginning of the 9th grade, you may do so for four full years; if you start participating at the beginning of 12th grade, you may do so for one full year. Eligibility to participate does not carry over from one year to the next.
