

MIAMI UNIVERSITY — ASSISTANT PROFESSOR OF CLINICAL PSYCHOLOGY. The Department of Psychology at Miami University invites applications for a tenure-track position in Clinical Psychology, to begin August 2010, at the assistant professor level. Candidates must have completed a PhD. from an APA-accredited clinical program and an APA-accredited internship prior to starting the position; postdoctoral fellowship experience and license eligibility preferred. We seek candidates with strengths in developmental or lifespan psychopathology, with preferred emphasis on adolescence and emerging adulthood. Research and clinical experience in working with diverse populations and families is highly desirable. Our clinical program is pluralistic and open to candidates of diverse theoretical orientations and methodological approaches, including mixed methods approaches. Interface with one or more of our clinical program areas of strength (trauma and resilience, psychotherapy research, narrative psychology, and child/family/community psychology) also is desirable. Candidates should have a strong background in and dedication to research and show promise for maintaining a high quality research program leading to scholarly productivity and potential for external funding. In addition, candidates should be committed to high quality teaching at the undergraduate and graduate levels, mentoring graduate and undergraduate research, supervising graduate level clinical practica, and engaging in university and professional service. The successful applicant will be expected to complete the requirements to become licensed as a psychologist in the State of Ohio. Our department has an excellent undergraduate program; thriving doctoral programs in clinical psychology, social psychology, and brain and cognitive science; and a modern psychology building (opened Fall, 2006), which provides spacious state-of-the-art research, teaching, and clinical training facilities. Miami also offers opportunities to collaborate in interdisciplinary work with programs including the Center for School-Based Mental Health Programs, the Center for American and World Cultures, the Scripps Gerontology Center, the Asian Studies Program, and the Qualitative Research Center.
